
Dear Mr. Metallic:

Your motion for leave to file an original proceeding under Article III of the Constitution was received April 22, 2011 and is hereby returned for the following reason (s):

The original jurisdiction of this Court does not extend to a suit by an individual against the United States. The original jurisdiction of this Court generally extends only to cases or controversies between two or more states or between the United States and one or more states. See 28 U.S.C. 1251 and Rule 17 of the Rules of this Court.

As a pro se litigant you can only represent yourself. The Court's original jurisdiction does not extend to suits by an individual against the United States or a foreign country. As a pro se litigant who is not a member of the Supreme Court Bar you cannot represent an entity such as an Indian Tribe.
